# **Notice to Contributors**

Bangladesh Pharmaceutical Journal is an international and multidisciplinary research and review journal, published by Bangladesh Pharmaceutical Society in January and July of each year. Original research papers or review articles are accepted on the understanding that they are subject to editorial revision, that their contents have not been published elsewhere and that in consideration of acceptance of a text for publication the copyright of the said text is assigned to the Bangladesh Pharmaceutical Journal.

#### **Contributions**

Manuscripts for publication and communications or concerning editorial matters should be sent to the Editor-in-Chief through E-mail: bpjeditor@ yahoo.com. A copy of the same should also be sent to the Executive Editor through e-mail: bpjexecutiveeditor@yahoo.com

#### **Preparation of Text**

Authors should consult a CURRENT issue of the journal and conform to the typographical conventions, use of headings, layout of tables and citation of references. Texts must be computer composed (MS office programs should be used in preparing the texts, charts and graphs) in double spacing and printed in one side of A4 size offset paper, with a minimum margin of 1 inch on all sides. Two sets of hard copies should be submitted along with soft copy in CD. The articles may also be sent through E-mail to the Editor-in-Chief or to the Executive Editor.

The name(s) of the contributor(s), affiliation of the laboratory where the work was done and a shortened title should accompany the typescript. A summary page should be included, describing results and conclusions in the form of ABSTRACT suitable for use as such by the abstracting journals. It should not exceed 250 words. A list of 3-6 Keywords should be supplied by the authors.

#### References

All citations in the text must appear in the References list and *vice versa*. In the text, the reference should appear as either: Ghani (1984) described, or As described previously (Ghani, 1984). When there are more than two authors, mention only the first author, e.g. Ghani *et al.*, 1984. If the year is same for several references identify these with a,b,c, etc. e.g. Ghani (1975a,b,c) both in the text and in the Reference list. In the Reference list, arrange the references in alphabetical order. References should follow the format shown:

#### **Abbreviations**

Abbreviations are used without periods. Standard abbreviations should be used throughout the manuscript. The preferred forms of some of the more commonly used abbreviations are mp, bp,  $^{\circ}$ C, K, s, min, h, ml,  $\mu$ l, kg, g, mg,  $\mu$ g, cm, mm, nm, mol, mmol,  $\mu$ mol, ppm, TLC, GC, NMR, MS, UV, IR, etc.

#### Tables

Tables should be typed in appropriate places in the text and numbered consecutively using Arabic numerals (e.g. 1, 2, 3). Their headings should briefly describe their contents.

#### **Graphs and Photographs**

All graphs and charts should be made with either MS Excel or Harvard Graphics software along with title and legends. Photographs, either coloured or black & white should be developed on glossy paper. Title and legends of the photographs should be typed at the end of the manuscript. The photographs should also be marked at the back with figures number and title of the paper.

If the author scans a photograph, the preferable file formats are Adobe photoshops, JPEG, PSD, BMP. The resolution should not be less than 200 and the size of the photographs should be at least double.

#### **Proofs and Reprints**

Galley proofs will be sent to the corresponding author, which s/he is requested to correct and return as soon as possible. No new matter be inserted in the text and **no changes be made in the title or author name(s) at the time of proof reading.** Corresponding author will receive 10 reprints free of charge.

#### **Declaration**

All authors are requested to sign a declaration that the work described in the manuscript was carried out by them and the contents of the paper have not been published before or submitted elsewhere for publication. When the number of authors/co-authors is more than one, the corresponding author is required to mention the exact contribution of each co-author and also indicate his/her percentage of contribution.


We are thankful to the authors who have contributed some of their finest work within a timeframe that has been quite challenging, and to the manuscript reviewers for their help in making this issue a great success.

**Professor Dr. Md. Habibur Rahman** (1960-2011)



Renowned Pharmacist and educationist, Professor Dr. Md. Habibur Rahman, died on February 18, 2011 at United Hospital, Dhaka (Inalilahi-waina-Ilahi-raji'un). He was 50 and had been suffering from long-term congestive heart failure and type II diabetes.

Professor Dr. Md. Habibur Rahman was born on December 31, 1960 in Bogra. He passed SSC and HSC from Rajshahi Cadet College with first division and completed B. Pharm. (Hons.) in 1982 and M. Pharm. in 1983 securing first class 1st and 4th position, respectively from the University of Dhaka. Later on, he earned Ph.D. degree in 1994, from the Faculty of Pharmacy, Kumamoto University, Japan and also conducted Post Doctoral Research at Sunderland University, UK in 2003.

Dr. Habib joined the Department of Pharmacy, University of Dhaka on August 08, 1989 as Lecturer. He became Professor on 22 September 2002. He rendered excellent service as the Chairman, Department of Pharmaceutical Technology and Director, Biomedical Research Centre. He also served as the elected Dean of the Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Dhaka, unfortunately for a very short time due to sudden cardiac problems, from October 13, 2010. In addition to excellent human qualities he had some extraordinary capabilities such as excellent teaching performance in Pharmaceuctics and Biopharmaceutics, remarkable research aptitude Biopharmaceutics with especial interest in DrugDrug/Protein interactions, development of controlled release dosage form. He was invited several times to deliver lectures on GMP training organized by WHO and the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh.

In his eventful life Professor Dr. Md. Habibur Rahman performed different significant duties for the country. He successfully served as the Director, Directorate of Drug Administration (National Regularity Authority for drugs and medicines) under the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh from 14 April 2004 to 13 April 2007.

Professor Habib was the author or co-author of a good number of research papers published in different peer-reviewed journals, notably International Journal of Clinical Pharmacology, Therapy and Toxicology, Journal of Pharmacodynamics, Biochemical Pharmacology, Fitoterapia. These journals are acknowledged as the leading scientific journals in the field of pharmaceutical sciences.

Beside his academic activities Professor Habib was engaged in different social and cultural organizations, where he proved his excellent organizational capacity. He worked as the Cultural Secretary of the Pharmacy Graduates Association, Bangladesh from September 1995 to January 1998, Chief Editor of Bangladesh National Formulary (BDNF) and Executive Editor of Bangladesh Pharmaceutical Journal. He was the Member of the

Pharmacy Council of Bangladesh, Member of governing bodies of different private medical colleges, Member of Ex-Rajshahi Cadets Association (ORCA), and many more. He also served as the General Secretary of Bangladesh Pharmaceutical Society. He attended more than 20 seminars and symposia in home and abroad. In addition, he participated several times in national debate competition. He spent time with us smiley at the last moment of his life.

He was highly-respected and admired in life and now remembered fondly by his former students, mentors, and friends. Often seen as brash and outspoken, he pushed his students and all concerned to strive for the highest degree of academic and professional excellence. He was a man who was seen by his colleagues and students as extraordinarily generous with his time and whole hearted personal support.

Professor Habib was a force of nature – a man with incredible energy and profound and endless commitment to the field of pharmacy. He was like a father figure to his students, creating a family who are now working in many institutions around the globe. No matter how busy he was—

he would always make time to talk to students and fellow colleagues.

When we heard the news of his expire our breath almost stopped, heart was sinking. We never experienced this feeling before. We wanted to scream at the top of our voice and say that it was not true. We don't have any blood relation with him but we feel we lost someone very near and dear to us.

Dr. Habib performed Hajj, Omrah and also Etekaff in the holy mosque of Madinah. We, members of the Bangladesh Pharmaceutical Society, and sure many like us felt in the same way. We will always have him in our prayers and we are sure many more will also pray for his departed soul for a long time.

Dr. Habib is survived by his devoted wife, two daughters, six brothers, two sisters, colleagues and thousands of friends and well wishers.

May Allah rest his soul in peace along with his companions in Al-Zannat and give his family courage and patience to put up with the loss-Ameen.
